Dr. Kidney holds undergraduate and graduate degrees from the Western College of Veterinary Medicine (WCV) at the University of Saskatchewan. She is Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Pathology since 1991. She was a diagnostic pathologist for 10 yrs at the Central Laboratory for Veterinarians in Langley BC and is currently a faculty member at the Department of Veterinary Pathology at WCV. Dr. Kidney's research involves mostly clinical problems in the areas of oncology, viral oncogenesis, molecular pathology and clinical chemistry.
